

# CLAIMS RESOLUTION TRIBUNAL

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In re Holocaust Victim Assets Litigation  
Case No. CV96-4849

## **Certified Denial**

to Claimant Ruth Lindemann

**Claimed Account Owner: Mathilde Kohn<sup>1</sup>**

Claim Number: 213327/RT

This Certified Denial is to the claim of Ruth Lindemann (the “Claimant”) to a Swiss bank account potentially owned by the Claimant’s mother, Mathilde Kohn (Häcker, Hoecker) (the “Claimed Account Owner”).

All denials are published. Where a claimant has not requested confidentiality, as in this case, only the name of the bank has been redacted.

### **Information Provided by the Claimant**

The Claimant submitted a claim stating that Mathilde Kohn, who was Jewish, was born on 18 December 1897 and resided in Vienna, Austria, where she married Leo Kohn (the Claimant’s father) in 1931. The Claimant further indicated that Mathilde Kohn and Leo Kohn fled Austria for the United States in 1941, where Leo Kohn passed away in 1978.

### **Information Available from the Austrian State Archive**

By decree on 26 April 1938, the Nazi Regime required all Jews who resided within the Reich, or who were nationals of the Reich, including Austria, and who held assets above a specified level to register all their assets as of 27 April 1938 (the “1938 Census”). In the records of the Austrian State Archive (Archive of the Republic, Finance), there are documents concerning the assets of Mathilde Kohn. These records indicate that Mathilde Kohn’s date of birth and her marital status.

### **The CRT’s Investigation**

The CRT matched the name of Mathilde Kohn (Häcker, Hoecker) to the names of all account owners in the Account History Database and identified accounts belonging to individuals whose names match, or are substantially similar to, the name of the Claimed Account Owner. In doing

so, the CRT used advanced name matching systems and computer programs, and considered variations of names, including name variations provided by Yad Vashem, The Holocaust Martyrs' and Heroes' Remembrance Authority, in Jerusalem, Israel, to ensure that all possible name matches were identified. However, a close review of the relevant bank records indicated that the information contained therein was inconsistent with the information the Claimant provided regarding the Claimed Account Owner. Accordingly, the CRT was unable to conclude that any of these accounts belonged to the Claimed Account Owner.

## **The CRT's Analysis**

### Identification of the Account Owner

The list below contains names of account owners that match the name of the Claimed Account Owner and the reasons why the CRT has concluded that the Claimed Account Owner and an account owner are not the same person. If an account owner's place of residence was published, that place of residence is also listed.

*Name: Mathilde Kohn (Austria)*

*Account Identification Numbers: 1011606; 1011607; 1011608*

*Specifically, the Claimant stated that her mother, Mathilde Kohn, was born on 18 December 1897 and was married to Leo Kohn, who passed away in the United States in 1978. Based on a comparison of the information contained in the 1938 Census records concerning Mathilde Kohn and the information contained in the bank records, the CRT concludes that the person reflected in the 1938 Census records was the account owner. The 1938 Census records indicate that the account owner was born over a decade before the Claimant's mother. The 1938 Census records further indicate that the account owner's spouse's fate was different from the Claimant's father's fate.*

### Right of Appeal and Request for Reconsideration

Pursuant to Article 30 of the Rules Governing the Claims Resolution Process, as amended (the "Rules"), the Claimant may appeal this decision or submit a request for reconsideration within ninety (90) days of the date of the letter accompanying this decision.

An appeal must be based upon a plausible suggestion of error regarding the CRT's conclusions set out in this decision. Any appeals which are submitted without a plausible suggestion of error shall be summarily denied. A request for reconsideration must be based on new documentary evidence not previously presented to the CRT that, if considered, would have led to a different outcome of the claim. Claimants should briefly explain the relevance of the newly submitted documents in view of the conclusions stated in the certified decision.

If more than one account has been treated in this decision, the Claimant should identify the account, including, where available, the Account Identification Number, that forms the basis of the appeal and/or request for reconsideration.

### **Scope of the Denial**

The CRT now considers the Claimant's claim to the accounts of Mathilde Kohn closed. Please note that this decision applies only to the Claim Number and Claimed Account Owner identified herein, and that the CRT is aware that the Claimant may have claimed accounts held by other persons or entities both in the Claim Number specified above and in other claims submitted to the CRT.

### **Certification of the Denial**

The CRT certifies this Denial for approval by the Court.
