**Claimed Account Owners: Irma Mayer
and L. Mayer (Power of Attorney Holder)**

Claim Numbers: 202080/RS; 400877/RS; 601422/RS¹

This Certified Denial is based on the claims of [REDACTED] (the “Claimant”) to accounts of Leon Mayer and Irma Mayer. The CRT did not locate an account belonging to Leon Mayer in the Account History Database prepared pursuant to the investigation of the Independent Committee of Eminent Persons (“ICEP” or “ICEP Investigation”), which identified accounts probably or possibly belonging to Victims of Nazi Persecution, as defined in the Rules Governing the Claims Resolution Process, as amended. This Denial is to the published account of Irma Mayer and to the published accounts over which L. Mayer held power of attorney.

All denials are published, but where a claimant has requested confidentiality, as in this case, the names of the claimant, any relatives of the claimant other than the account owners, and the banks have been redacted.

Information Provided by the Claimant

The Claimant submitted a claim in 2001 asserting that his maternal aunt, Irma Mayer owned a Swiss bank account, and that Mayer was her maiden name. In 2005, the Claimant submitted a claim asserting that his maternal grandfather, Leon Mayer, who was married to [REDACTED], held power of attorney over a Swiss bank account. The Claimant stated that both his aunt and grandfather perished in the Holocaust.

The CRT’s Investigation

The CRT matched the names of Irma Mayer and Leon Mayer to the names of all account owners in the Account History Database and identified accounts belonging to individuals whose names match, or are substantially similar to, the name of the Claimed Account Owner. In doing so, the CRT used advanced name matching systems and computer programs, and considered variations

of names, including name variations provided by Yad Vashem, The Holocaust Martyrs' and Heroes' Remembrance Authority, in Jerusalem, Israel, to ensure that all possible name matches were identified. However, a close review of the relevant bank records indicated that the information contained therein was inconsistent with the information the Claimant provided regarding the Claimed Account Owner. Accordingly, the CRT was unable to conclude that any of these accounts belonged to the Claimed Account Owner.

The CRT's Analysis

Identification of the Account Owner

The list below contains names of account owners that match the name of the Claimed Account Owner and the reasons why the CRT has concluded that the Claimed Account Owner and an account owner are not the same person. If an account owner's place of residence was published, that place of residence is also listed.

Name: Irma Mayer

Account Identification Number: 2015987

Specifically, the Claimant stated that his relative's maiden name was Irma Mayer. In contrast, the bank records show that the account owner had a different maiden name.

Name: L. Mayer [Power of Attorney Holder]

Account Identification Number: 5029983 and 5035983

Specifically, the Claimant stated that his maternal grandfather's name was Leon Mayer. In contrast, the bank records show that the power of attorney holder was female and had a different first name. In addition, the CRT notes that the Claimant did not identify the account owner as his relative, and that under Swiss law, a power of attorney holder is not considered to be the owner of an account. After a power of attorney holder dies, his or her powers in an account no longer exist, and they do not pass to his or her heirs. Therefore, even if the Claimant had identified the power of attorney holder, but not the account owner, as his relative, the Claimant would not have been entitled to the account unless there was evidence in the bank's records that the power of attorney holder and the account owner were related.

The Claimant should note that all accounts awarded by the CRT are published upon release on the CRT's website at www.crt-ii.org.

Right of Appeal and Request for Reconsideration

Pursuant to Article 30 of the Rules Governing the Claims Resolution Process, as amended (the "Rules"), the Claimant may appeal this decision or submit a request for reconsideration within ninety (90) days of the date of the letter accompanying this decision.

An appeal must be based upon a plausible suggestion of error regarding the CRT's conclusions set out in this decision. Any appeals which are submitted without a plausible suggestion of error shall be summarily denied. A request for reconsideration must be based on new documentary

evidence not previously presented to the CRT that, if considered, would have led to a different outcome of the claim. Claimants should briefly explain the relevance of the newly submitted documents in view of the conclusions stated in the certified decision.

If more than one account has been treated in this decision, the Claimant should identify the account, including, where available, the Account Identification Number, that forms the basis of the appeal and/or request for reconsideration.

Scope of the Denial

The CRT now considers the Claimant's claim to the accounts of Irma Mayer and Leon Mayer closed. Please note that this decision applies only to the Claim Number and Claimed Account Owner identified herein, and that the CRT is aware that the Claimant may have claimed accounts held by other persons or entities both in the Claim Number specified above and in other claims submitted to the CRT.

Certification of the Denial

The CRT certifies this Denial for approval by the Court.
