## **Certified Denial**

to Claimant [REDACTED]

**Claimed Account Owners: Karl Pollak and Rudolf Pollak<sup>1</sup>**

Claim Number: 501189/SB

This Certified Denial is to the claim of [REDACTED] (the “Claimant”) to a Swiss bank account potentially owned by the Claimant’s relatives, Karl (Carl) Pollak and Rudolf Pollak (the “Claimed Account Owners”).

All denials are published, but where a claimant has requested confidentiality, as in this case, the names of the claimant, any relatives of the claimant other than the account owner, and the bank have been redacted.

### **Information Provided by the Claimant**

The Claimant submitted a claim stating that Karl Pollak and Rudolf Pollak were Jewish and resided in Austria. The Claimant stated that Karl Pollak was born in 1886 and died in 1971. The Claimant further stated that Rudolf Pollak was born in approximately 1902 or 1903, and held a doctorate degree in chemistry.

### **The CRT’s Investigation**

The CRT matched the names of Karl (Carl) Pollak and Rudolf Pollak to the names of all account owners in the Account History Database and identified accounts belonging to individuals whose names match, or are substantially similar to, the name of the Claimed Account Owners. In doing so, the CRT used advanced name matching systems and computer programs, and considered variations of names, including name variations provided by Yad Vashem, The Holocaust Martyrs’ and Heroes’ Remembrance Authority, in Jerusalem, Israel, to ensure that all possible name matches were identified. However, a close review of the relevant bank records indicated that the information contained therein was inconsistent with the information the Claimant provided regarding the Claimed Account Owners. Accordingly, the CRT was unable to conclude that any of these accounts belonged to the Claimed Account Owners.

## **The CRT's Analysis**

### Identification of the Account Owners

The list below contains names of account owners that match the names of the Claimed Account Owners and the reasons why the CRT has concluded that the Claimed Account Owners and an account owner are not the same person. If an account owner's place of residence was published, that place of residence is also listed.

*Name: Carl Pollak (Vienna, Austria)*

*Account Identification Numbers: 5025150, 5027516 and 5032637*

*Specifically, the Claimant stated that his relative, Karl Pollak, died in 1971. In contrast, the records show that the account owner died decades earlier.*

*Name: Karl Pollak (Vienna, Austria)*

*Account Identification Numbers: 5023958 and 5024023*

*Specifically, the Claimant stated that his relative, Karl Pollak, was born in 1886 and died in 1971. In contrast, the records show that the account owner was born several years later and died several decades earlier.*

*Name: Rudolf Pollak (Austria)*

*Account Identification Numbers: 1014616 and 1014617*

*Specifically, the Claimant stated that his uncle, Rudolf Pollak, was born in approximately 1902 or 1903 and held a doctorate degree in chemistry. In contrast, the records show that the account owner held a title at the time the accounts were opened, which the Claimant did not identify, and which is inconsistent with the Claimant's relative's age at the time that the accounts were opened.*

### Right of Appeal and Request for Reconsideration

Pursuant to Article 30 of the Rules Governing the Claims Resolution Process, as amended (the "Rules"), the Claimant may appeal this decision or submit a request for reconsideration within ninety (90) days of the date of the letter accompanying this decision.

An appeal must be based upon a plausible suggestion of error regarding the CRT's conclusions set out in this decision. Any appeals which are submitted without a plausible suggestion of error shall be summarily denied. A request for reconsideration must be based on new documentary evidence not previously presented to the CRT that, if considered, would have led to a different outcome of the claim. Claimants should briefly explain the relevance of the newly submitted documents in view of the conclusions stated in the certified decision.

### **Scope of the Denial**

The CRT now considers the Claimant's claim to the accounts of Karl Pollak and Rudolf Pollak closed. Please note that this decision applies only to the Claim Number and Claimed Account Owners identified herein, and that the CRT is aware that the Claimant may have claimed accounts held by other persons or entities both in the Claim Number specified above and in other claims submitted to the CRT.
