Certified Denial

to Claimant [REDACTED]

Claimed Account Owners: Franz Weiss and Samuel Weiss¹

Claim Number: 735702/HB

This Certified Denial is to the claim of [REDACTED] (the “Claimant”) to a Swiss bank account potentially owned by the Claimant’s relatives, Franz Weiss and Samuel Weiss (the “Claimed Account Owners”).

All denials are published, but where a claimant has requested confidentiality, as in this case, the names of the claimant, any relatives of the claimant other than the account owner, and the bank have been redacted.

Information Provided by the Claimant

The Claimant submitted a claim stating that Franz Weiss, who was Jewish and homosexual, resided in Vienna, Austria. The Claimant further stated that Samuel Weiss, who was Jewish, resided in Vienna and was the owner of a cutlery business. The Claimant did not indicate any academic or professional title held by her relative Samuel Weiss.

The CRT’s Investigation

The CRT matched the names of Franz Weiss and Samuel Weiss to the names of all account owners in the Account History Database and identified accounts belonging to individuals whose names match, or are substantially similar to, the name of the Claimed Account Owners. In doing so, the CRT used advanced name matching systems and computer programs, and considered variations of names, including name variations provided by Yad Vashem, The Holocaust Martyrs’ and Heroes’ Remembrance Authority, in Jerusalem, Israel, to ensure that all possible name matches were identified. However, a close review of the relevant bank records indicated that the information contained therein was inconsistent with the information the Claimant provided regarding the Claimed Account Owners. Accordingly, the CRT was unable to conclude that any of these accounts belonged to the Claimed Account Owners.

¹ The Claimant should note that this determination relates only to the Claim Number and Claimed Account Owners stated above, and that the CRT is aware that the Claimant may have submitted other claims.

The CRT's Analysis

Identification of the Account Owners

The list below contains names of account owners that match the names of the Claimed Account Owners and the reasons why the CRT has concluded that the Claimed Account Owners and an account owner are not the same person. If an account owner's place of residence was published, that place of residence is also listed.

Name: Franz Weiss (Germany)

Account Identification Numbers: 1014493; 1014494; 1014495; 1014496; 1014497

Specifically, the Claimant stated that her relative, Franz Weiss, resided in Austria. In contrast, the records show that the account owner resided in Germany.

Name: Franz Karl Weiss (Hungary)

Account Identification Number: 1000423

Specifically, the Claimant stated that her relative, Franz Weiss, resided in Austria. In contrast, the records show that the account owner resided in Hungary. The CRT further notes that the Claimant did not identify the account owner's middle name.

Name: Franz Xaver Weiss

Account Identification Number: 5027658

Specifically, the Claimant stated that her relative, Franz Weiss, resided in Austria. In contrast, the records show that the account owner resided in a different country. The CRT further notes that the Claimant did not identify the account owner's middle name.

Name: Samuel Weiss (Bratislava, Slovakia (Slovak Republic))

Account Identification Number: 3017011

Specifically, the Claimant stated that her relative, Samuel Weiss, resided in Austria. In contrast, the records show that the account owner resided in Slovakia.

Name: Samuel Weiss (Austria)

Account Identification Number: 1000504

Specifically, the Claimant stated that her relative, Samuel Weiss, resided in Austria and was the owner of a cutlery business. The Claimant did not indicate any academic or professional title held by her relative. In contrast, the records show that the account owner held such a title and had a different profession. The records further show that the account owner resided in an additional country that was not identified by the Claimant.

The Claimant should note that all accounts awarded by the CRT are published upon release on the CRT's website at www.crt-ii.org.

Right of Appeal and Request for Reconsideration

Pursuant to Article 30 of the Rules Governing the Claims Resolution Process, as amended (the "Rules"), the Claimant may appeal this decision or submit a request for reconsideration within

ninety (90) days of the date of the letter accompanying this decision.

An appeal must be based upon a plausible suggestion of error regarding the CRT's conclusions set out in this decision. Any appeals which are submitted without a plausible suggestion of error shall be summarily denied. A request for reconsideration must be based on new documentary evidence not previously presented to the CRT that, if considered, would have led to a different outcome of the claim. Claimants should briefly explain the relevance of the newly submitted documents in view of the conclusions stated in the certified decision.

If more than one account has been treated in this decision, the Claimant should identify the account, including, where available, the Account Identification Number, that forms the basis of the appeal and/or request for reconsideration.

Scope of the Denial

The CRT now considers the Claimant's claim to the accounts of Franz Weiss and Samuel Weiss closed. Please note that this decision applies only to the Claim Number and Claimed Account Owners identified herein, and that the CRT is aware that the Claimant may have claimed accounts held by other persons or entities both in the Claim Number specified above and in other claims submitted to the CRT.

Certification of the Denial
